#### UNOFFICIALLY UNDERWAY

The title defense of Lubbock Christian University's second NCAA Division II national title season officially gets underway Nov. 8 in Pueblo, Colo., but their exhibition schedule can't be overlooked. The Lady Chaps play a trio of exhibition games against nationally ranked NCAA Division I opponents. Two of their games have been completed and LCU preps for their final game, which is set for Monday (Nov. 4) evening at No.8 Mississippi State University. Their tough preseason slate opened Oct. 28 at No.15 Texas (83-73 loss) and followed with a 98-63 loss at No.1 Baylor, which marked a battle between defending NCAA Division I and Division II national champions. LCU raised eyebrows in their prior two games. At Texas, LCU was down 65-61 in the fourth quarter and had a 42.4% - 40% shooting advantage from the field in the game. At Baylor, LCU shot 42.9% in the third quarter and were outscored 46-34 in the second half of play. Combining the exhibition schedule with the regular season, LCU will play their first five contests on the road before their home fans are able to see them at home Nov. 15.

their game Wednesday marked LCU's second-ever game against a defending Division I national champion. They faced 2014-15 national champion UConn during the 2015-16 exhibition season in Hartford, Conn. Both LCU and UConn went on to claim a national championship in their division in 2015-16. This season marks LCU's first season to play three Division I foes. Last season was LCU's first season to play a pair of Division I opponents, as they played exhibition games at SMU (in Dallas) and New Mexico (in Albuquerque, N.M.).

#### GLANCING BACK AT LAST SEASON

Success has turned into an expectation for the Lady Chaps, but last season's Division II national title for LCU was not fully expected. The Lady Chaps were opening the season without a returning All-American, as they were without Tess Bruffey, who completed her 2017-2018 season and career as a two-time Heartland Conference Player of the Year. Bobbi Chitsey and Olivia Robertson were LCU's only members off their 2015-16 championship season last year, and the two would be serve as pieces of the puzzle to lead LCU to a 32-5 national championship season. LCU was out of the top-25 for 11 of the in-season D2SIDA polls

#### POWER EXHIBITION SCHEDULE

Diving further into LCU's trio of exhibition games,

and eight of the in-season WBCA polls, but was able to win the Heartland Conference regular season title and conference tournament to clinch a berth to the South Central Region Tournament as a No.3 seed. Lubbock Christian garnered a road victory at No.2-seed and No.15-nationally ranked Colorado Mesa (in a sold out Brownson Arena) in the region tournament and topped Angelo State in the region championship inside a sold out Rip Griffin Center to garner a trip to their third Elite Eight Tournament (all in a four-season span). LCU topped No.20 North Georgia, No.1 Drury and No.4 Southwestern Oklahoma State en route to the title in Columbus, Ohio. Their win over SWOSU for the title came in double-overtime (a NCAA Division II first), with returning forward Maddi Chitsey nailing a three-pointer in the closing seconds of overtime to force the second overtime.

#### WHO RETURNS

Maddi Chitsey (13.8 pts., 5.7 reb.), Caitlyn Cunyus (6.2 pts., 2.9 reb.) and Allie Schulte (10.6 pts., 3.0 reb.) are returning mem-

bers from last season's squad. They represent three of LCU's top-four leading scorers from last season. Juliana Robertson (4.7 pts. 3.8 reb.) started twice and came off the bench 35 times and "Madi" Madelyn Turner (3.4 pts., 1.0 reb.) made 36 appearances off the bench, as the two were vital depth members last season. Each will see starts this season. LCU was without Cunyus in the exhibition season and Turner served as point guard in those contests against Division I squads, which showed its importance during the season. Ashton Duncan, who hit 16 of her 26 three-pointers in conference play, Laynee Burr (42.9% from three-point range), Channing Cunyus (58.6% shooting from the field) and junior Taylor Stevenson return to add depth at the perimeter. Emma Middleton (averaged 3.2 points in 7.7 minutes per game) joins Chitsey and Robertson as returning inside players.

### WHO THEY LOST

Bobbi Chitsey, Olivia Robertson and Kailin Davis will be missed on the LCU roster. Chitsey and Robertson were starters last season and are LCU's only players part of two championship squads. Robertson claimed Most Outstanding Player in last season's championship game. She averaged 14.7 points per game last season, averaging 17.7 per game in the Elite Eight Tournament. She closed out her LCU career with 1,107 points in 124 games played. Robertson finished with the third-best career free-throw shooting percentage (87.3%) in program history. Bobbi (averaged 8.9 points per game last season) finished her LCU career with 892 points and 418 rebounds in 122 games. She posted a career field goal shooting mark of 50.4%, which included 74 three-point field goals. Davis was a "sixth-player" for the Lady Chaps and was one of five players to appear in all 37 games. The Air Force transfer averaged 3.3 points per game last season and spent two seasons with the Lady Chaps.

### NEW FACES

There are four new additions, who will dawn a Lady Chaps jersey for a first time this season. The four newbies consist of three freshmen and a sophomore transfer. The first-year Lady Chaps are Courtney Andersen, Whitney Cox, Savannah Sumrall and Brylee Winfrey. Andersen is a sophomore junior college transfer joining the Lady Chaps roster from Eastern Arizona College. She appeared in 30 games (29 starts) and led the team in blocks (34). The guard averaged 6.8 points and 4.5 rebounds per game. Cox comes to LCU from Flower Mound High School. She averaged a team-leading 12.2 points a game last season as a senior, with a team-best 9.5 rebounds a game. Cox spent four seasons with the varsity, including her freshman season as a teammate of sister Lauren, who was a two-time state Gatorade Player of the Year and is at Baylor. Sumrall comes to Lubbock Christian from Wellington High School (Wellington,

Texas), where she was a three-time Class 2A All-State selection for the Skyrockets in basketball (TGCA all three years and TABC in 2019) and an All-State selection in Cross Country in 2018 as a senior. The Amarillo Globe named her to the Super Team following her senior season, as she averaged 14 points and five rebounds a game to claim District 2-2A MVP honors and led Wellington to the Region I-2A finals. Winfrey continues a long tradition of recruits making the LCU roster from Canyon, Texas and Canyon High School. The guard had an enjoyable senior season last year as District 3-4A MVP, additionally claiming All-State honors in basketball and cross country.

### NATIONALLY KNOWN

The preseason rankings for the 2019-20 season were released Wednesday (D2SIDA along with Lone Star Conference) and Thursday (WBCA) and the Lady Chaparrals carry the highest expectations in program history to start a season. D2SIDA placed the defending national champions No.1 and the WBCA ranked LCU No.2 despite the Lady Chaps receiving 14 of the 23 first place votes. Each ranking is their highest preseason ranking in program history. The LSC has LCU ranked No.1 in their preseason rankings, as they prepare for their first season of competition in the conference (last season LCU was member of the Heartland Conference).

### FIVE THINGS ABOUT MSU

1 > The Bulldogs are coming off 33-3 campaign in 2018-19, claiming an SEC regular season and tournament title (went 15-1 in the SEC) before falling to Oregon in the Elite Eight of the NCAA Women's Basketball Tournament in Portland, Ore. They went 16-1 at home inside Humphrey Coliseum last season.

2 > Mississippi State is preseason picked third in the SEC Media Poll behind South Carolina and Texas A&M. The Bulldogs is preseason ranked No.8 by USA Today / WBCA and No.10 by Associated Press.

3 > Last season, the Bulldogs played Central Missouri (another Division II program LCU has faced twice over the past two seasons) in an exhibition game. The Bulldogs defeated CMU 97-56. They played Arkansas - Fort Smith the prior two seasons.

4 > Speaking of UAFS, the contest between LCU and Mississippi State has a lot to do with Bulldogs assistant coach Elena Lovato. The former West Texas A&M student-athlete was on Vic Schaefer's coaching staff from 2014-2016 before serving as head coach for two seasons at UAFS, where they battled LCU. She was able to lead UAFS to an NCAA South Central Region Tournament appearance in 2018.

5 > MSU features the talents of Chloe Bibby and Jordan Danberry, who are preseason All-SEC selections. Danberry ranked third on the team in scoring with 13.1 points per game and was second in assists (125) and steals (65) after starting all 36 games last season. The graduate guard scored double figures in 13 of 16 SEC games and averaged 14.3 points during conference play. She also ranked eighth in the league with a 1.47 assist/turnover ratio. Bibby was one of the most efficient three-point shooters in the country. She ranked No. 22 in the country and third in the SEC in three-point field goal percentage, shooting a 45-percent mark from beyond the arc before suffering a season-ending injury in January. Bibby recorded seven games with at least three three-pointers and scored in double figures 14 times for an average of 11.9 points per game. The junior forward also averaged 4.1 rebounds and 1.6 assists per game while shooting .481 from the field.

received 17 points from Sierra Lovorn and 15 points from Jordan Hampton (11-for-13 from the free-throw line) to lead the Lady Chaps to a regular season win at Rip Griffin Center. It was HBU's first season playing a NCAA Div. I schedule.

### Nov. 9, 2009 - LCU 71 - Texas Tech 65

No. 19 Lubbock Christian University used 22 points from Brittany Hampton and a 40-29 rebound advantage to upset Texas Tech University at United Spirit Arena. Hampton scored 14 of her 22 points in the second half, and went 15-for-15 from the free-throw line, which would have been a school single-game record for free throws made without a miss if it had been a regular season game. LCU was 26-for-30 (86.7%) from the line in the game. They also received 15 points from Severyn Smith.

### Nov. 2, 2013 - LCU 80 - Houston 73

Nicole Hampton produced a double-double (20 points and 15 rebounds) and Kelsey Hoppel produced 21 points leading to an 80-73 exhibition victory over the University of Houston at Hofheinz Pavilion. Emily Pool added 14 points for LCU, who hit 41 percent from the field, nailed 11 three-pointers and outrebounded Houston 53-49. The Coogs were held to 29 percent shooting.

Nov. 3, 2015 - UConn 95 - LCU 39

A blocked shot by Kellyn Schneider, followed by a Tess Bruffey bucket in the opening sequence of the game, led to a 2-0 LCU lead and a buzz from over 200 LCU fans in attendance, but it was short lived as Breanna Stewart went 10-of-12 from the field and her 25 points helped UConn to victory. The 56-point margin was UConn's smallest margin of victory in exhibition play since 2011 and the Huskies were also held under 100 points for only the second time in exhibition play since 2012. Both teams went on to go 35-0 in the regular season and each won national championships in Indianapolis.

Oct. 28, 2018 - LCU 62 - SMU 51

LCU forced SMU into 21 turnovers and a 35.7% shooting mark from the field in a victory over the Mustangs at Moody Coliseum. LCU the game for over 35 minutes in the contest, LCU was 42.9% (24/56) from the field, with 10 of their 24 made field goals launched behind the arc. Maddi Chitsey (15) and Robertson (13) combined for 28 points and were two of four Lady Chaps to finish in double figures. Allie Schulte and Ashton Duncan each had 11 points. Schulte also had five steals and five rebounds. LCU forced SMU into 21 turnovers, leading to a 29-14 scoring advantage in points off turnovers.

Oct. 30, 2018 - New Mexico 62 - LCU 55

New Mexico only outscored Lubbock Christian University in one of four quarters, but a 22-8 outburst in the second quarter was enough to defeat the Lady Chaparrals inside Dreamstyle Arena (The Pit). LCU outscored UNM 12-10 in the first quarter and 19-14 in the final quarter. The Lady Chaps offense faltered in the second quarter, going 3-of-17 (17.6%) from the field and 1-of-10 (10%) from long distance. LCU finished the game 4-of-23 from three-point range. UNM outrebounded LCU 43-41. Maddi Chitsey led LCU with 13 points and her sister Bobbi provided 10 points. Kailin Davis had seven points, six rebounds and a +10 plus/minus rating. They had trouble with UNM's Jaisa Nunn, who was 6-of-6 from the field with 17 points.

Oct. 28, 2019 - Texas 83 - LCU 73

Take away the opening two minutes, or a 10-0 run the Texas opened the game with during the span, and it was an even-stein contest, as LCU fell 83-73 inside Frank Erwin Center. LCU was able to gradually come back and bounced back from a 12-point halftime deficit, as Madelyn Turner was 4-of-4 from long range in the second half and produced 16 points in the half to help LCU pull to within four points of the Longhorns (65-61) in the fourth quarter. Texas responded with seven straight points from the free-throw line to claim the win despite LCU having a 42.4% - 40% shooting advantage from the field in the game. Maddi Chitsey led LCU with 22 points and Turner finished with 18 points. Joanne Allen-Taylor fueled Texas with 24 points.

Oct. 30, 2019 - Baylor 98 - LCU 63

A pair of defending NCAA championship squads hit the hardwood of the Ferrell Center Wednesday night, as Division I national champion Baylor defeated defending Division II national champion Lubbock Christian University 98-63 behind Lauren Cox, who had 24 points, eight rebounds and six assists for Baylor. LCU trailed 26-18 after the opening quarter and had trouble slowing down Baylor's 59.5% shooting from the field in the first half, which led to a 52-29 halftime lead. LCU had a much more competitive second half. Allie Schulte exploded for 10 points in the third quarter and LCU was 7-of-17 (42.9%) from the field (3-of-6 from three-point range) in the quarter. Baylor outscored LCU 20-19 in the quarter and took a 72-48 lead in the fourth quarter. The Lady Chaps played all 14 players and many of the depth players made their exhibition season debuts in the fourth quarter. Baylor outscored LCU 46-34 in the second half, as the Lady Chaps fell 98-63. Along with Lauren Cox's solid performance, the Lady Bears received a double-double from former Texas Tech Lady Raider Erin DeGrate (17 points and 10 rebounds). They also received 21 points from Te'a Cooper. Baylor was 55.6% from the field off 40-of-72 shooting. LCU, 35.6% (21/59) from the field, was led by Chitsey, who posted 16 points. She was one of four Lady Chaps to hit double figures. Turner and Schulte each posted 14 points and Emma Middleton had 12 points in 13 minutes (along with five rebounds) off 4-of-5 shooting.

In 10 seasons at the helm while an NAIA institution, the Lady Chaps made 10 consecutive trips to the NAIA Division I Women's Basketball National Championship tournament. Coach Gomez's arrival to the LCU women's basketball program certainly changed the foundation of the program. In those 10 seasons at the helm, LCU posted a 234-96 record under Gomez in the NAIA.

LCU jumped into NCAA Division II transition in 2013 (membership in 2015) and the results have not changed since transitioning. LCU went a remarkable 25-1 overall in 2013-2014 and they completed the Heartland Conference with a perfect 20-0 mark for their first perfect conference record in program history. They followed in 2014-2015 claiming Co-Heartland Conference Regular Season title honors after a 15-3 stretch in conference and a 21-7 overall season. That led to a remarkable 2015-2016 season. A season that started off with an exhibition game loss at NCAA Div. I No.1 Connecticut and ended with a perfect 35-0 season in LCU's first season eligible for NCAA postseason. They went 18-0 in Heartland Conference play to capture a regular season title and then a Heartland Conference Tournament title (first season eligible for the tournament). The Lady Chaps went on to capture a South Central Regional Tournament title and eventually a NCAA Div. II National Title. Gomez claimed WBCA NCAA Div. II National Coach of the Year honors and also spent a portion of the offseason as a court coach at the 2016 USA Basketball Women's U17 World Championship Team Trials in Colorado Springs, Colo.

2015-16 served as a rebuilding year for the Lady Chaps, who returned one starter off the championship squad. Despite the rebuilding, LCU still went 19-11 overall and 12-4 in conference, en route to the Heartland Conference Tournament championship game, which they lost to St. Edward's. They bounced back in 2017-18, claiming another Heartland Conference regular season and tournament title, leading to Gomez receiving Heartland Conference Coach of the Year honors. The Lady Chaps hosted the NCAA Division II South Central Region Tournament for a second time and won the tournament to stamp their second berth towards an NCAA Division II Elite Eight Tournament loss. They lost to eventual national champion Central Missouri at the tournament held in Sioux Falls, S.D., ending their season with a 31-2 record.

The Lady Chaps returned to the Elite Eight Tournament for the third year in a four-year span in the 2018-19 season after claiming a Heartland Conference regular season and tournament title, along with a NCAA Division II South Central Region tournament championship after wins at Colorado Mesa and at home over Angelo State. LCU made an outstanding run towards their second NCAA Division II National Title, defeating Southwestern Oklahoma State in double overtime to claim the trophy. Gomez, who picked up his third Heartland Coach of the Year honor, became the seventh head coach in NCAA Division II women's basketball history to claim multiple titles. He also was named Female Team Coach of the Year at the West Texas Sports Persons of the Year Banquet following the season.

In 16 seasons at LCU (the 2019-20 season marks his 17th), Gomez enters the 2019-2020 season with a 397-122 collegiate coaching record. He also enters his squad into Lone Star Conference play for the first time. He completed Heartland Conference play with a 118-17 (.874) overall record.

In their final two seasons in the NAIA (2011-2012, 2012-2013), LCU set program single-season win records in each of the seasons. The Lady Chaps went 31-4 in 2013-2014, setting a program single-season wins mark (31). The Lady Chaps won their first ever Sooner Athletic Conference Tournament title en route to their final trip to the NAIA National Championship tournament. In 2011-2012, LCU went 28-6 and made their second ever appearance in the Semifinals of the NAIA National Championship Tournament. They lost out to eventual national champions Oklahoma City to mark the second consecutive season in which they lost out to the team who would claim the title. LCU claimed their second Sooner Athletic Conference crown in program history, as they joined Oklahoma City as conference co-champions with a 21-1 record. They handed OCU their only loss of the season.

LCU went 25-10 in 2010-2011 and marched into the Elite Eight for a third time in program history. The Lady Chaps, who finished third in the Sooner Athletic Conference, lost in the NAIA National Championship to eventual national champion Azusa Pacific.

LCU went 19-12 in the 2009-2010 season, which included a 13-9 finish in the Sooner Athletic Conference, and had their season come to an end in the National Tournament. The highlight of the season was an exhibition victory inside the United Spirit Arena against Texas Tech University.

In 2009-2010, the Lady Chaps finished with a solid 27-7 record and made a trip to the Sweet Sixteen of the National Tournament following a second-place Sooner Athletic Conference season. Gomez chalked up a milestone during the season, becoming the all-time women's basketball wins leader at LCU.

LCU had a memorable 2007-2008 campaign, as the Lady Chaps made another voyage to the NAIA National Tournament. The Lady Chaps completed a 25-10 season, which included a trip to the Elite Eight in the tournament for their second best finish in program history.

In 2006-2007, Gomez led the Lady Chaps to a myriad of firsts in their near thirty year history. Lubbock Christian never left the top-10 in the NAIA National Poll, and set a school mark for wins in a season with 26, eclipsing the school mark of 23 they set the prior season. In addition, LCU made its fourth consecutive trip to the NAIA National Tournament, finishing in the Sweet Sixteen and most impressively, the Lady Chaps captured a share of the Sooner Athletic Conference regular season championship, becoming the first school from outside of the State of Oklahoma to do so in the thirty-one years since the conference was founded.

In 2005-2006, Gomez's Lady Chaps enjoyed what was arguably at the time the best season in school history, as they finished with an overall record of 23-12, and made an unparalleled run at the NAIA National Tournament. Seeded sixth in their eight team bracket in the tournament, Gomez's girls proceeded to oust four of the top six teams in the nation and become the lowest seed ever to reach either the Fab Four or National Championship; appropriately enough, he was named the SAC's Coach of the Year.

In his first season, Gomez's Lady Chaps went 16-14 and finished fifth in the Sooner Athletic Conference. While this might appear to be an average year, big wins for the Lady Chaps and entry into the NAIA National Poll for the first time proved good enough for an at-large bid to the NAIA National Tournament: LCU women's first trip to the big dance. In his second season, the Lady Chaps were able to maintain that level of success. After getting off to the best conference start since joining the Sooner Athletic Conference at 6-2, LCU finished SAC play at 10-8, good enough for another fifth place finish, and for the second season in a row, Coach Gomez guided the Lady Chaps to the NAIA National Tournament.

An LCU graduate, Gomez was a standout perimeter player for Coach John Copeland in the late 1980s, and to this day, he still holds the school record for career free throw percentage at .855. He graduated in 1988 with a Bachelor's of Science Degree in Mathematics and consistently used his degree to teach in the classroom while pursuing coaching on the sidelines. Gomez's career began at Lubbock Monterey High School where he served as an assistant coach in the men's basketball program from 1988 to 1995. In 1996, Gomez accepted the men's basketball head coaching position at Lubbock Cooper High School, where he remained until returning to Lubbock Christian University to take over the reigns of the Lady Chaps in 2003. During his seven seasons at Cooper, the basketball program broke new ground making the playoffs four times, managing the school's first state ranking, and capturing the Pirates only district championship in Gomez's final season. One of the main reasons Coach Gomez is so successful on the court is the support he receives off of it. Steve has been married to his wife Shawna for 29 years, and the couple has two children: Hayden and Landon.



### VIC SELF ASSISTANT COACH

Self is a longtime familiar face to basketball among the South Plains. He spent 25 years coaching basketball at Lubbock's Monterey High School and 20 spent as the head coach of the Plainsmen boy's basketball team. Self is no stranger to LCU. The Portales, New Mexico native lettered in basketball and tennis at Lubbock Christian in 1980-1981, after spending two years at Eastern New Mexico University. His first coaching job was as an assistant coach for John Copeland on the Chaps basketball staff. In two decades at Monterey, Self compiled a 416-237 record, four district titles and 13 playoff appearances. Monterey even made a trip to the regional tournament. He rejoins Gomez, but in a reversal of roles. Gomez served as an assistant for Self from 1988-1996. Self resigned from coaching basketball in 2008, but continued to coach boy's golf at Monterey until retiring in 2011.



### KAYCIE WILSON - ASSISTANT COACH

Kaycie joined the LCU women's basketball coaching staff in the 2014-15 season as a graduate assistant through the 2015-16 season. She played an integral role in the coaching staff when the Lady Chaps went on to win the NCAA Div. II National Championship in the 2015-16 season. She spent her senior season (2013-14) playing in the interior of LCU's first season in the Heartland Conference, which went 20-0 in conference for a regular season first place finish. She spent three seasons (09/10 - 11/12) at NCAA Div. I Missouri-Kansas City, where she combined to average 4.9 points and 3.9 rebounds in 87 games. The forward also combined for 44 steals, 95 assists and 34 blocks for UMKC (21 blocks as a sophomore). Boyles was a multiple recipient on The Summit League Winter/Spring Academic All-League Team and the Commissioner's List of Academic Excellence as a distinguished scholar. She is a Lubbock native and a product of Coronado High School, where she was rated the No.45 best forward in the nation by Collegiate Girls Basketball Report and the No.55 best player in Texas by Premier Basketball Report. The multi-winning All-State recipient was named the Girls Basketball Player of the Year by the Lubbock Avalanche Journal, as well as the 2009 5A-4A All-South Plains Player of the Year after 17.6 points and 7.9 rebounds a game.

## LCU Claims Second National Championship in Program History

There were no losers Friday night inside Alumni Hall for the NCAA Division II Women's Basketball National Championship, but there was a winner... Lubbock Christian University's Maddi Chitsey nailed a three-pointer with 2.5 seconds left to force the first-ever double overtime contest in the history of the NCAA Division II title game, and the No.5-seed Lady Chaparrals outscored No.2-seed Southwestern Oklahoma State 20-10 in the second overtime to pull off a 95-85 upset win for their third upset-win of the tournament and their second NCAA Division II national championship title in program history.

LCU had trailed for 4:22 of the five-minute first overtime. Bethany Franks connected on a three-pointer 21 seconds into the first overtime, proving the Lady Bulldogs much of the first overtime momentum. LCU's lone seniors, Bobbi Chitsey and Olivia Robertson, each connected on streaking shots down low and their 4-0 run provided LCU a 72-71 lead with 35 seconds left. The lead was brief, as Franks got SWOSU the lead back with a field goal with 21 seconds remaining. Following an LCU turnover, LCU was forced to foul, and they put Taber Beer to the line. Beer hit both free-throws, sending the Lady Bulldogs faithful in attendance into a frenzy as they led 75-72 with 11 seconds remaining.

The Lady Chaps had they shot they wanted, with Olivia Robertson slipping behind a screen on the right side of the perimeter and launching an open three-point attempt. It hit off the back-iron and did not go in. The rebound carried all the way to the right-elbow, where Allie Schulte leaped for the offensive rebound. She tossed it to the right corner, where Maddi Chitsey was waiting. Chitsey completed an open step-back three-pointer and it went in with 2.5 seconds left, sending the fourth NCAA Division II title game overtime to a first double overtime.

SWOSU attempted to open the second overtime as they did the first, with a three-pointer, but their first two attempts were unsuccessful. They ended up missing their first seven attempts, which LCU capitalized on. LCU, who closed the game making their final five field goal attempts (eight of their last nine, with Robertson's three-point miss serving as the lone miss) received a jumper and three-point from Robertson and it ignited a 10-0 run for LCU. The Lady Chaps cruised from there, outscoring SWOSU 20-10 in the second overtime.

The Lady Bulldogs had four sequences in the game in which they missed at least six consecutive shots (LCU never missed more than four consecutive shots at any point throughout the game). The biggest dry spell for SWOSU came at the opening tip of the contest. LCU opened the game on a 10-0 run and an early time out allowed SWOSU to prevent any further immediate damage. Bailey Tucker got SWOSU back into the game. She drew a foul on a three-point play in the closing seconds of the first quarter, cutting LCU lead to 17-11 at quarter's end. SWOSU trailed by six points despite shooting 11.8% (2-of-17) in the quarter.

Tucker had two of the five Lady Bulldogs three-point makes in the second quarter quarter. A 19-4 SWOSU run in the second quarter allowed them to take a 33-26 lead into the dressing room. Tucker opened the third quarter with a three-pointer (a string of three-straight made from long range) building the advantage to 10 (36-26). The Lady Bulldogs would then go 4-of-17 from the field (23.5%) and LCU would rattle off a 15-0 run covering a span of three minutes and LCU regained the lead at 41-36. LCU would outscore SWOSU 29-16 in the quarter to head into the fourth quarter leading 56-49.

LCU struggled from the field in the fourth quarter. They closed regulation making two of their last nine attempts. Neither team had a field goal in the final 80 seconds. LCU only had one shot attempt taken in the span, while SWOSU had a pair of unsuccessful attempts, which led to the game carrying into overtime.

Southwestern Oklahoma State fell short of claiming their first NCAA Division II in program history. Their season ended at 35-2. Hailey Tucker posted 30 points and 16 rebounds in a double-double performance, which led to All-Tournament Team honors. Tucker's points and rebounds were the highest posted against the Lady Chaps (in each category) this season. They also received 25 points from Franks and 12 points from Hayden Priddy.

LCU received a double-figures from five players, with Maddi Chitsey leading all Lady Chaps with a double-double consisting of 22 points and 13 rebounds. Olivia Robertson led LCU with 24 points. Schulte finished with 17 points and Bobbi Chitsey and Caitlyn Cunyus each had 10 points. Cunyus also tied a career high with seven rebounds. Schulte finished 1-of-2 from three-point range and finished the season 60-of-116 from three-point range (51.7%) setting a program single-season record for three-point percentage.

Chitsey and Robertson claimed All-Tournament Team members for the tournament, with Robertson claiming Most Outstanding Player of the tournament. Robertson averaged 17.7 points per game. Chitsey averaged 22.3 points per game at the tournament.

Robertson was playing in her 124th career game, sitting a new Heartland Conference record for career games (Nicole Hampton holds the LCU record at 129). She finished her LCU career with 1,107 career points. Over her LCU career, Robertson compiled an 87.3% career free-throw shooting percentage, which ranks third all-time in LCU program history. Bobbi Chitsey also concludes her LCU playing career. She competed in 122 career games (tied for third place on the Heartland Conference career list of games played). Chitsey compiled 892 career points. The pair of seniors, who are each All-Conference selections this season, have a four-year record of 117-17 (87.3%), which includes a 57-5 conference record, and they went 58-0 in home games.

The championship is the second in program history. The Lady Chaps, who completed the season 32-5, claimed their first national title in 2015-16, which was their first season eligible for NCAA postseason play. LCU is ninth team in NCAA Division II to win multiple national titles in women's basketball. Lady Chaps head coach Steve Gomez becomes the seventh head coach in NCAA Division II women's basketball history to claim multiple titles.

LCU's title in women's basketball is the 16th national title for all programs. The university has 11 national titles among their running programs, while baseball (two) and softball join the two titles in women's basketball to account for the 16 titles.

## INSIDE THE NUMBERS

LCU's road to the title involved ending 35-game win streaks to each of their final two opponents. Drury (semi-final game) was 35-0 before falling to LCU and SWOSU lost their season opener before winning 35 straight games until losing to the Lady Chaps Friday. Speaking of 35, LCU's first national title was off a 35-0 season.
